

Understanding Addiction



A unique online training program for those who work directly or indirectly with people who face challenges with addiction

Offered by the Canadian Mental Health Association's (CMHA) BC Division, this course is designed to increase knowledge, enhance self-awareness and strengthen skills.

By the end of the course, participants will:

- Gain a better understanding of addiction
- Learn effective, practical skills to increase comfort in responding to addiction in a positive and respectful way
- Develop confidence in working with challenging clients while protecting workplace safety
- Build greater comfort in having conversations that promote inclusion and healthy communities

What participants can expect

Understanding Addiction includes eight interactive online lessons that feature opportunities for personal reflection, downloadable resources and a facilitated forum.

Learn about the factors behind addiction and control, the dynamics of helping people change and what to do in difficult situations. Participate in opportunities to practice skills that will challenge you to do things differently and better understand the impact of stigmatizing language and beliefs.

Online learning

Understanding Addiction is self-paced and accessible through any computer, smart phone or tablet. Participants have three months to work through the eight lessons at their convenience. Each lesson takes about 60 to 90 minutes complete.

Opportunities for enhanced engagement are supported through moderated forums and downloadable resources.
