Given the extent of damage, repiping seemed to be the only option. But the copper component of the newly repiped system would eventually fail just like its predecessor, adding enormous cost and tenant discomfort to an already serious problem.



CuraFlo and Engineer Steve Bruskiewich of MCW Consultants Ltd. proposed a unique solution: Break the existing copper piping system down into smaller sections using flexible connectors that isolated each section from the rest of the plumbing system, thus reducing overall system stress. Then each of the existing piping sections was lined with

CuraPoxy®, CuraFlo's proprietary epoxy, resulting in a resilient new plumbing system built inside the existing system.
