Extension of Work Sharing Program	Work-Sharing (WS) is an adjustment program designed to help employers and employees avoid layoffs when there is a temporary reduction in the normal level of business activity that is beyond the control of the employer. The duration of the program will be extended from 38 weeks to 76 weeks.	 Non-profits who meet the following criteria: Have been a non-profit for at least two years. Have a reduction in the level of business activity not related reduced revenue levels alone (for example, grants, donations, memberships, etc.). Business activity is defined as the selling of goods or services with an objective to earning profit. Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy	Non -profits who qualify for the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy will be able to get 75 % of each employee's salary covered, on the first \$58,700 earned this year, for a maximum of \$847 per week. The	The entity applying for the program must demonstrate a 30% decline in 'gross' revenues to qualify, or 15% decline for revenues in March 2020. Canada Emergency Business Account	The Canada Emergency Business Account (CEBA) provides interest- free, partially forgivable, loans of up to \$60,000, to small businesses and not-for-profits, that have experienced diminished revenues due to COVID-19 but face ongoing non-deferrable costs, such as rent, utilities, insurance, taxes and wages.	Organizations who paid between \$50,000 to \$1 million in total payroll in 2019.	Employers can apply for support until March 31, 2021 through their banks and credit unions.
Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy	The Canada Emergency Rent Subsidy (CERS) provides a direct and easy-to-access rent and mortgage subsidy of up to 65% of eligible expenses to qualifying businesses, charities and non-profits.
